Recap since last Month's report:

Environmental Enforcement

- 1. We had a total of 12 new OSSF Applications in July
- New OSSF applications for July total 12 Residential and 0 commercial. We Currently have 8 applications approved for construction and awaiting installation and final inspection.

- 3. July OSSF quantity application (oars) reports to TECQ have been filed. We are up to date and on schedule with them.
- 4. Received 1 complaints of possible violations, Health and Safety Nuisance violations, substandard buildings (dilapidated & abandoned), Possible Hazmat material. All incidents have been investigated.
- 5. We had a total revenue of \$149.11 from metal revenue. Standard Bulk Trash revenue collection was \$321.00 and \$560.00 for a Total of \$1,030.00. Total Revenue for July.
- 6. We have notified TCEQ via Certified Mail that we have complied with their suggested changes and sent them copies of our new application logs and complaint logs.
- 7. We have executed the OSSF outsourcing contract with Ronnie Stuard, effective August 1st 2025. We are in the process of turning over all pending applications and he will handle all new OSSF applications. The internal process for record keeping is being refined and established. Going forward, things should be much smoother and less time consuming administratively.
- 8. All of our installation contractors have been informed of the outsourcing change and they are now reporting to Ronnie for questions and installation scheduling.
- 9. We have installed our 4 new game cameras (thanks to Road & Bridge) in likely locations for illegal dumping. Hopefully we will have some success with those soon.
- 10. Myself, along with Deputies Holman, Edwards and Jerry attended a 2day advanced training course, sponsored by TCEQ at ETCOG in Killgore. This the beginning stage of an organized approach to stronger crackdown on Health and Safety Code violations with many properties that are long overdue in the county.

Emergency Management:

- 1. Think positive about a NEW Justice Center.
- 2. We are waiting on Road & Bridge schedule before ordering everything for the Mobile Emergency Operations Van, including the new A/C system, Generator, Tires and remodel the interior, install the radios and electronics.
- 3. The Floodplain Administrator education / training classes were delayed by FEMA, due to budget cuts. However, I have had two calls with them regarding training and they are sending some videos and study material. They are expecting to resume the training classes soon.
- 4. Our regularly required LEPC meeting was scheduled for July 10th. However, we only had 2 people that attended, not enough for a quorum and thus we had to cancel the meeting. Very disappointing. I plan to reschedule our meeting to late August or early September and advertise it more. This LEPC (Local Emergency Planning Committee)

is a requirement from the State and administered by TCEQ. An active and functioning LEPC is required in order qualify for State Grants and thus very important to our Grant program.

2.0 SCOPE OF SERVICES

2.1 Asbestos Survey

Terracon will physically assess suspect ACM for friability and evidence of damage or degradation and collect bulk samples of suspect ACM for laboratory analysis.

Terracon will collect bulk samples of accessible suspect ACM in general accordance with the sampling protocols outlined in USEPA 40 CFR Part 763 Subpart E 763.86, the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) and the TAHPR. The total number of samples collected will depend on the number of homogeneous areas of suspect ACM identified. Samples will be collected based on our current understanding of the scope of work, site conditions, experience with similar structures, and applicable state regulations. The Client must agree to defend and hold Terracon harmless from subsequent liability and damages that may result from sampling activities.

To the extent reasonable, Terracon will limit sampling to discrete locations. Sample collection will result in some isolated damage to building materials; however, Terracon will attempt to limit such damage to only the extent necessary for investigation and sample collection. Terracon will not be responsible for repair or touch-up of sample locations. Some materials cannot be sampled without considerable damage to the finish or function of a material (e.g., mirror mastic, ceramic tile adhesives or mortar beds, and roofing). Suspect ACM not sampled will be assumed to contain asbestos, recorded, and quantified.

Client has authorized destructive sampling.



2.1.2 Sample Analysis

A TDSHS licensed and National Voluntary Laboratory Accreditation Program (NVLAP) accredited laboratory will analyze bulk material samples by Polarized Light Microscopy (PLM) using the "Interim Method of the Determination of Asbestos in Bulk Insulation Samples" (USEPA Method 600/R-93/116); the type and percent concentration of asbestos, where applicable, will be determined by visual estimation. When PLM sample results are greater than zero but less than 10% asbestos, USEPA NESHAP regulations and the TAHPR require the sample be reanalyzed using the more quantitative Point Counting technique or the material be considered ACM. Point Count and/or Transmission Electron Microscopy (TEM) analysis will not be performed as part of this scope of work; if PLM results merit re-analysis by Point Count or TEM, Terracon will contact the Client for authorization to proceed if additional costs will be incurred.

2.2 Limitations

The work completed in the Scope of Services will be limited to readily observable and accessible materials and surfaces. Hidden or not readily accessible materials (e.g., piping in walls, hidden insulation treatments, hidden structural components, materials under carpet, etc.) may not be assessed in this survey; Terracon will make reasonable effort to access suspect materials within known areas of restricted access (e.g., crawlspaces) provided these areas are not determined to be permit-required confined spaces or to pose a health or safety risk to our personnel. Sampling will not include suspect materials which cannot be safely reached with an 8' to 10' A-frame ladder or a 24' extension ladder.

2.3 Report

Terracon will prepare a written Asbestos Survey Report (Report) describing the sampling methodology and the results of the survey, the location of each homogeneous area of suspect ACM sampled for or assumed to contain asbestos, the number and location of building material samples collected, the analytical results, the estimated quantity and condition of materials identified or assumed ACM. No estimates of ACM removal costs will be provided under the scope of this proposal. Terracon will submit its report in portable document format (pdf) via e-mail to the Client.

Reliance on the Report by the Client and all authorized parties will be subject to the terms, conditions and limitations stated in the Agreement for Services (and sections of this proposal incorporated therein), the Reliance Agreement, and the Report.

AGREEMENT FOR SERVICES

This **AGREEMENT** is between Rains County TX ("Client") and Terracon Consultants, Inc. ("Consultant") for Services to be provided by Consultant for Client on the 239 N. - 1. Scope of Services. The scope of Consultant's services is described in the Proposal, including but not limited to the Scope of Services section ("Services"), unless Services are otherwise described in Exhibit B to this Agreement (which section or exhibit is incorporated into this Agreement). Portions of the Services may be subcontracted. When Consultant subcontracts to other individuals or companies, then consultant will collect from Client on the Subcontractors' behalf. Consultant's Services do not include the investigation or detection of, nor do recommendations in Consultant's reports address occupant safety issues, such as vulnerability to natural disasters, terrorism, or violence. If Services include purchase of software, Client will execute a separate software license agreement. Consultant's findings, opinions, and recommendations are based solely upon data and information obtained by and furnished to Consultant at the time of the Services.
- 2. Acceptance/ Termination. REC Definition

RECs are defined by ASTM E1527-21 as "(1) the presence of hazardous substances or petroleum products in, on, or at the subject property due to a release to the environment; (2) the likely presence of hazardous substances or petroleum products in, on, or at the subject property due to a release or likely release to the environment; or (3) the presence of hazardous substances or petroleum products in, on, or at the subject property under conditions that pose a material threat of a future release to the environment." This ESA includes consideration of the movement of hazardous substances and petroleum products in any form, including migration of vapor in the subsurface. A de minimis condition is not a REC.

Review of Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS)

There are a family of compounds known as per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) which are considered emerging contaminants of concern due to their mobility and longevity in the environment. Physical Setting

WHEREAS, the Provider represents that they are qualified and willing to provide such services on the terms and conditions set forth in this Contract;



- 1. Services. - Indemnification. The Provider agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the County, its officers, agents, and employees from and against any claims, damages, losses, or expenses arising out of or related to the Provider's performance of the services, except to the extent caused by the County's negligence or willful misconduct.
- Governing Law. This Contract shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, without regard to conflict of laws principles. Venue for any dispute shall lie exclusively in the courts of Rains County, Texas.
- 8. Entire Agreement. This Contract constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior understandings, whether written or oral. No amendment shall be effective unless in writing and signed by both parties.
- 9. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Contract is held invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall continue in full force and effect.
- 10. Waiver. No waiver of any breach shall constitute a waiver of any subsequent breach.
- 11. Notices. All notices required hereunder shall be in writing and delivered to the addresses specified above or as otherwise designated by the parties.

MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

INVOICE / ORDER # 7401

1. MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT CPI agrees to provide to the customer, during CPI's normal business hours, the maintenance service, caused by normal operational use necessary to keep the equipment in, or restore the equipment to, good working order in accordance with CPI's policies then in effect. The foregoing service warranty constitutes Customer's sole and exclusive remedy. THE FOREGOING WARRANTY IS IN LIEU OF ALL IMPLIED, INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION, ANY WARRANTY OF MERCHANTABILITY OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE CPI SHALL NOT UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES BE LIABLE FOR ANY SPECIAL, INDIRECT, INCIDENTAL OR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGESN OR ECONOMIC LOSS, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO LOSS OF PROFITS, REVENUE, OR LOSS OF EQUIPMENT USE, EVEN IF CPI HAS BEEN ADVISED OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SUCH DAMAGES OR LOSS, OR FOR ANY CLAIM CUSTOMER BY ANY OTHER PARTY.






