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Petition to Oppose the Establishment of a Salvage Yard at 3552 S State Highway 19, Emory, TX 75440

To: Rains County Commissioners Court

We, the undersigned residents and stakeholders of Rains County respectfully submit this petition to express our strong opposition to the proposed establishment of a salvage yard at 3552 S State Highway 19, Emory, TX 75440.

Key Concerns

1. Violation of Location Restrictions

Under Texas Transportation Code §396.022, salvage yards must not be located within 50 feet of a public road or residential property line

The proposed site is adjacent to State Highway 19 and near residential properties, raising serious legal and safety concerns.

2. Environmental Hazards

Salvage yards are subject to strict environmental regulations due to the handling of hazardous materials such as used oil, batteries, antifreeze, and scrap tires

Improper management can lead to soil and groundwater contamination, threatening local ecosystems and public health.

3. Stormwater Pollution Risks

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) requires salvage yards to implement a **Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP)** to prevent runoff of pollutants

The proximity of the proposed site to water bodies and residential wells increases the risk of contamination.

4. Community Impact and Aesthetics

The site is located on a visible stretch of Highway 19, a gateway to Emory. A salvage yard would detract from the rural and residential character of the area, potentially lowering property values, discouraging and undermining the long-term growth, future development and appeal of Rains County.

- A public hearing to allow community input, as required under Texas law
- An environmental impact study to assess risks to water, soil, and air quality.
- Enforcement of zoning and screening regulations, including fencing and setback requirements.

We urge the Commissioners Court to prioritize the health, safety, and quality of life of Rains County residents and reject any proposals that would allow a salvage yard to operate in or near residential areas.

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
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




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Public Hearing Concerns

Eye Sore On Seeing The Cars & The Fence

Response: We understand that the cars can become an eyesore if you had to pass by and see them everyday. Just as most mechanic shops have 25+ vehicles infront of their shop and are constantly working through repairing them and new ones coming in. We have all passed by them whether they're in town or out of town. We have to follow a different set of guidelines set forth by the state that refer back to the Texas Beautification Act compared to a mechanic shop though, where you have to have an 8' Barrier around this type of business if its facing a roadway or residential property. It also states that in a county with less than 200,000 people it can be 6' tall instead of 8' tall, but Rains County states in its requirements it has to be 8' tall. By having this 8' barrier fence you will not be able to see the vehicles or the processing of them. As discussed with the officials we will be following the more stringent requirements that are set. It will also help keep the noise down is why they require it too. That's why most drilling rigs setup barrier walls when they're drilling wells and working close to neighborhoods in certain areas to be respectful of the noise. If you're unsure what the fence will look like, you can refer to C&H carports which is catty corner from this property, they have the same style fence following down CR 2300 at a height of 7 1/2 'tall going east and then at 5' height going south, which follows around the side and back of their property for approximately 800' in length. So this fence is already being used and driven by daily and has been for years and has never seem to be a problem before.

Noise Ordinance

Response: Rains County does not impose any noise ordinances on anyone or any businesses in the county. The county refers back to the State Penal code 42.01

which states "intentionally or knowingly making unreasonable noise in or near a private residence that one has no right to occupy" is illegal. We will have the right to occupy this property as we will own it and it will be a business. So that law does not apply to us, as we are not doing anything wrong because we are the owners of said property. We have already considered the noise made from the car crusher and we are going to place it in a respectable location where it keeps the noise away from the 3 surronding houses the best we can and to a respected decibel reading to help keep the noise down. Also, the crusher will not run everyday, it will only run for a couple of hours, a few days a week, & at a respectable time during business hours. By us having the car crusher there and running it, then we are able to keep vehicles cleaned and out of the yard, which gives us plenty of room to be able to work SAFELY & efficiently.

**Next door to this property there used to be Drifters Club-Bar 20 years ago, but it has been closed down for a long time. It is currently getting a revamp and we were told it will be a mexican restaurant and have a bar area inside it. Depending on their scheduled hours, and what it truly gets turned into, that would be more of a concern on noise as it will be open later in the evening than we will be.

Stacked Vehicles

Response: According to the state regulation we are not allowed to stack vehicles taller than 8' from ground level. That's why the state and the county has the rule set in place, that there has to be a 6-8' tall barrier around the location of a UAPR Business. Furthermore we will have more land use at this property than the area we are currently leasing in Dallas. That's also why we have a crusher on site, therefore we can process vehicles and crush them as needed at a respected time during business hours have them picked up and hauled to the mill. So we won't have the need to stack vehicles. If for any reason we did, then they would never exceed taller than 8' per the State Regulation. Also to make you aware, some of you may have seen from a social media post a bunch of vehicles stacked at a salvage yard. Those vehicles were sold to another individual that rented a space at the same yard as we do. Those vehicles did not belong to us anymore and that person was removed from being a tennant at that yard years ago when that occurred for not following the state's regulation that reads no vehicles can be

stacked taller than 8' from ground level. The video was done just for advertising purposes.

Hours of Operation

Response: We are going to run similar business hours to the other commercial businesses in the area of the property. Therefore, we will not be running machinery or being loud at night. From time to time we may have tow trucks that come and drop off vehicles or roll off dumpsters, but that's all that will be taking place outside of our normal posted operating hours, which that task is not loud and requires NO machinery. We all have families that we provide for and we would much rather go spend our evenings and nights with them rather than working. The work will be there the next day when we arrive back.

Fuel, Oil, & Possible Spillage

Response: All auto parts recyling facilities are regulated by The State of Texas, & TCEQ. We will also be regulated by Rains County. Therefore we have guidelines that are set we have to follow and abide by. That's why we are here today, and not at the property working without permits and doing things incorrectly, like they have been done before at this property. We have been working with each department listed above. We are paying a Reputable Environmental Firm that has and will continue to handle all of the Soil Sampling & SWPP. We have our Storm Water Prevention Plan completed, submitted and approved by the respected parties. That plan ensures that we set up containment zones where they're needed for the proper drainage of fuel, oil, & fluids and dispose of them properly. If we encounter spillage, water run off, or soil contamination, it provides a detailed summary on how we will take the corrective actions to clean them up. All of those things are laid out in the SWPP that is required to be submitted & approved by those officials, which has been completed. It takes into consideration the rain water, the bar ditches, etc. also the nearest creek which is 1.5 miles to the East and then next one which is over 3 miles away. We have to have soil samples ran multiple times a year, every year. Continuous training for our workers throughtout the year- every year and an open door policy for

environmental to come and do random checks at any time. Those samples have to pass criteria to stay in regulation & to maintain operation. We are not taking any shortcuts and we are taking this very seriously, as this business provides income for our employees, our employees families, as well as our own. The same way your job or business does for your family.

Lead Service Lines for water as older structures were plumbed with water service lines made of lead.

Response: There is no existing water meter at the property therefore the shop does not have water ran to it or plumbed anywhere on this property.

Underground Storage Tanks buried on property

Response: In 1986 TCEQ came out with the requirement for any underground storage tanks to be registered with TCEQ. Our environmental firm went back through all the records that should've been filed at this property if there were any and there show to be no underground storage tanks ever registered on this property. If for any reason we happen to find one during our work activities building the containtment zones or anything needed for environmental or to make operational, then we will stop what we are doing and notify the respected officials required, then get instructions from them on how to move forward, but the State, TCEQ, & County does NOT require anyone to go on an adventure hunt looking for them either. We are not excavating the property up for dirt use as discussed with the officials. So we will address that "What If" if or when we encounter any underground storage tanks.

Tax Break:

Response: We have not and we will not file for any kind of tax break. We are going to be paying our fair share in state & county taxes just as anyone else is. We are not asking for any special treatment or tax evaluation adjustment. We are here to improve this property and the value of it. We will be paying sales tax on applicable parts or services we provide out of this location, no matter the business.

Turned down & Not applicable in Canton-Van Zandt County:

Response: We considered several other counties and areas to open this business up in. We came to the conclusion of Rains County, as Rains County does not have this type of service here. Any person in the county that needs a used auto part or is taking any type of recyclable metal anywhere is having to go do this in another county. In todays world with the cost of everything so high, you can't blame people for trying to save where they can and buy used auto parts for a fraction of the price vs new. We have purchased several vehicles from people in the rains county area that have had old junk cars, piles of metal, and scrap at their property needed a place to dispose of them. I'm sure as many of you travel around the county roads and area you can see all the places that need this service too. This will give them a chance to have somewhere local to bring it to vs them having to drive an hour round trip to other cities and counties for this service. Which will help keep tax dollars and money spent locally versus out of town. We have never been turned down at all in ANY county. The nearest locations for this type of service currently is Canton-Myers, Quinlan-AIM, Mineola-K&L & Sulphur Springs-Reed, they all have places similar to this, so we would not be bringing anything new to those communities as they already have this type of business there. They all follow similar Regulations as its set by the their county & the State. We are bringing something to a community that is not here, but very much needed.

Moving from Dallas and Location

Response: We live in the surronding counties and travel to the metroplex to work, just like many others do in this county. We are looking to move our operation closer to home where we can spend more time with our families and less time on the road driving. Let's face it, The most dangerous thing every human does everyday is get behind the wheel and drive their vehicle, that's how we all got here today, I'm assuming no one rode a horse to the court house, we also see the need for this service as their isnt one in this county and as stated before people have to travel to other towns to haul off their cars, scrap metal, etc. Whereas if we are here, you can spend less time traveling and more time with your families or doing more important things that are safer than being behind the wheel driving. We are also choosing to move out of Dallas because the yard that we operate out of is not owned by us, we have to pay rent there, as well as other overhead that is

not moving us forward in life as a company. We have no control over who comes and goes from the yard, or how clean it should be, just the small area that we rent out, inside this facility. We are trying to move forward in life and buy an asset, just as I'm sure most of you here today, own your own home and don't rent it. We also want to contribute to a community that needs our service and give back where we can. We have been on the TV - American Pickers cleaning up properties, doing junk removal. This is a full time job for us that we have built over many of many of years and we are trying to grow it. We are not a fly by night outfit, trying to hide anything or do things incorrectly.

18 Wheeler Passage

Response: The 18 wheelers that are coming to load out recyled cars & items will be coming from I-20-which is South of the properties location. The property is located 3 miles south of Emory, TX- from HWY 69.

So that would mean there wouldn't be trucks passing all through town, even though hwy 19 is the main passage for 18 wheelers or any vehicles coming from I-30 area to get to I-20. There are several truck stops at I-20 and they are building a new fuel station at I-20 and 19 in canton, and about to break ground I believe at Hwy 19 & 80 for another one. As I was called about it for a bid on some work there. So they have no reason to pass through town as they will be going back towards I-20 to get back to the Mill and there are plenty of fuel stations on their already traveled path. Also, they will be entering and exiting from State HWY 19 at all times, not the County Road. We are being respectful of the county road that adjoins this property & to the local residence that drive down it daily to not cause possibly damage to the CR from the 18 wheelers like HWY 19 is.

Property Valuation around this Business

Response: We understand your concern, that this may or may not have a negative valuation in this area, which is subject to a persons own opinion. This property currently has no electricicity, water meter, water service lines or Septic on site. The shop/office needs a lot of work, as it has water damage on the inside of the building due to grading issuses around it. Once we add these things as well as a fence, containment zones and we are running a business from it, that will substantionally increase the property valuation. Which in return we will be paying more in property taxes for this place, as well as the sales tax on muliple

businesses. This is a positive effect on this property as it has been sitting pretty well vacant for years, ran down, and has just been an over grown fenced area that has sat and created a haven for critters to live on. No one on the panel is over property Appraisals. That's a different divison, If we need to do a deeper dive into that we can, but at the very least know this, this property is 5 acres of land and the shop which is roughly 1,800-2,000 sqft and is valuing on appraisal for more than another property that has the same acreage but is 5 times the sqft which is fully finished out, heated and cooled with all utility services. That was previously listed on market for a Substantional amount of money. Also, the place on the north side of this property was zoned commercial from 2004 until 2018. Incase you were not aware of that, I wanted to let you know. Therefore the owners adjoining this property decided to invest in their property, knowing their property was zoned commercially 20 years ago and continued to be left that way for 14 years. As well as the property we are under contract on, as they both used to be 1 tract of land owned by an Oil/Gas company. This is just one of the many properties in this area, that all have been zoned for commercial use for 10-20 years.

Zoning

Response: This property is zoned commercially and has been for a very long time. We are not seeking to have it re-zoned or asking for an area that is residentially zoned out by itself to be changed to commercial zoning. The area that the property is located around in Rains County is considered a rural-corridor commercial area. As it has 10 other commercially zoned buisnesses in a 1.5 mile radius from this property and 7 of those are actually under ½ mile from this property. We are following the guidelines that are set, as it is already zoned commercially and has been for a very very long time.

Setback

Response: Per State & County Regulation, since we will be following the more stringent requirement, we will go off of the state code for this, which says: the setback requirements that you have to maintain is 50' away from a public street, Hwy, & nearest property line of a residence. It also states the fence can be built with natural objects, planting, or fences. We are going to go with a 8' barrier as the county outlines and it is more stringent on the height, and we are choosing

to build with fencing materials, but not required to, as we could plant trees as a barrier per both regulations. We've sent over drawings to the state & county with our plans on fencing showing the layout with the setback and without it going along the property with respect to the Residence property line to the North. As stated before that property to the north was zoned commercial for 14 years, but its now zoned residential. We will have the 8' barrier fence line built around the Used Auto Parts Recyling Business with respect to the current County & State Regulations requirements and zoning that have been set in place as of the day our application was turned in and receipted on 8-6-2025.

Closing Statement

To close this out, I want to thank everyone for giving The Junkies LLC a chance to answer the concerns that were made from the public. I believe we have answered the concerns accordingly. We are following all of the State and County regulations and will continue to. We have never operated at this location in Emory. We have done our research & reviewed the previous lawsuit case file that occurred at this property. We are very much aware that when a previous owner had the property back in 2020 that property owner never abided by the State nor County regulations to operate there as a Used Automotive Parts Recycling Business. There were 7 infractions that were brought to light during that case. All 7 of those infractions were Not following the State or County regulations that's why it was shut down. I cannot exercise this enough WE ARE NOT THEM!!, We have never tried that nor will we. We have showed the county officials that from day 1 throughout this process. We have not went through any shortcuts. We have done our due diligence and went through every step as required by the State, TCEQ, and the County and we have all applicable permits for this business at this location that is zoned commercially. If for any reason we are doing things incorrectly, we ask you to hold us accountable. We are not trying to junk the community up, but instead, clean the junk from it one driveway & pasture at a time.

County Delays

- 1. Wes met with the county commissioner on July 31st, 2025 at 9:00am at the Rains County District Clerks office to submit all of The Junkies LLC UAPR Application and required paperwork. The paperwork was reviewed by Precinct 1 County Commissioner and the County Environmentalist over that weekend, then it was submitted into the Clerks office. Once it was submitted on August 4th, 2025 it was receipted and the check cleared on August 8th, 2025. At the time it was submitted & reviewed. The application was supposed to be filed and input into the courthouse clear box for the public to see it in a visible location for 10 days prior to the meeting. We were told we would be moving forward and on the action item list on August 14th, 2025 & it was documented that way not as a presentation on the Court Documents. On August 14th, 2025 we were told the application was lost by the county, therefore we had to fill out a new application at that time, submit it, and then it was inserted into the glass case at the courthouse for the public to view and then that pushed it back another minimum of 10 days since it was never done so. Due to the loss of the application and never being input, the August 14th, 2025 meeting turned into a presentation of the company instead of a take action item as it was.
- 2. We were then told, the Public hearing would be set for August 28th and then we would be set on the take action item list to be voted on that same day throughout commissioners court. We come to find out some verbiage in the regulations had been mis-interpeted on both us and the county as it's a new process for both parties. We had to have an ad in the paper for 3 weeks before the hearing not 2 weeks. So then that pushed the public hearing and take action item for The Junkies to September 11th, 2025. On September 8th, 2025, the county documents

came out for scheduling and we were scheduled for the Public hearing on September 11th, 2025, but not under the take action item list as we were told we would be several times and that it would be the same day as the public hearing at each time it was set. When asked about it, we were told that it got missed and we missed the window to add it to the docket for the Septmeber 11th, 2025 county court date due to the New Public notice act that took affect on September 1st, 2025 that it has to be 72 hours before the county commissioners court which is at 10:00am and we had this conversation around 2pm on September 8th, 2025. So therefore now we are are being delayed on getting this voted on yet again.

I'm submitting this as I was told to do so, that way it could be taken into consideration and it would be documented on the delays.

We are all human and this is new to both parties going through this process. We are here to work together and to grow into this community and want the support from everyone involved. We started this conversation and process on April 28th, 2025. We truly figured we would have this closed out by now and be moving forward. We would like to have this vote happen at the next commissioners court as we have other businesses that are starting to be affected by this that we own. Since we have been tied up for months on a contract for this property and we cannot expand our other businesses due to us being in the middle of a land purchase. We have strung the sellers along also and the realtors along for an extended period and was not intending to do so. We understand we are at the mercy of the panel and hope you take this into consideration.

To clarify towards our previous conversation we are NOT taking Mandamus Action at this time, as we believe everyone is truly trying to work together and understands both oppositions.

1.0 Introduction

1.1. General Information

The Junkies LLC Company, based in Emory, Texas owns and operates a Recycling/Auto Salvage Facility located at 3552 South Highway 19 in Emory, Texas (hereafter referred to as the facility).

The Junkies LLC has submitted a Notice of Intent (NOI) for obtaining coverage under Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (TPDES) Multi-Sector Industrial General Permit TXR050000. The Junkies LLC's Primary SIC code is 5015 under Sector M (Automobile Salvage Yards) with a secondary SIC code 5093 Sector N (Scrap and Waste Recycling Facilities). Consequently, this Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWP3) was developed in accordance with General Permit TXR050000, Part III, Permit Requirements, Section A.

A copy of the SWP3 and all supporting documents will be retained at the facility and shall be made available to all employees, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) and or state and local agencies.

1.2. Facility Location

The Junkies LLC Facility is located at 3552 South Highway 19 in Emory, (Rains County) Texas. The Property consists of approximately four acres. The Latitude and longitude of the facility is 32.823825, -95.785792. The Facility is adjoined to the north by Hawthorne custom tables, Highway 19 to the East, County Road 1285 to the West and County Road 1280 to the South. The general location of the facility is shown on Figure 1 in Appendix 1.

1.3. Plan Updates and Amendments

The SWP3 should be updated whenever changes occur that have the potential to affect how stormwater is managed at the facility. Updates to the SWP3 may be handwritten. Examples of changes that may require an update to the SWPPP are:

- A change in facility operations (leased area increases or decreases, new operations, new materials stored onsite, paving, etc.);
- new best management practices (BMPs) are implemented;
- change in operation and maintenance (O&M) procedures;
- modification of the stormwater system;
- · pollution prevention team changes; and changes in permit requirements.

2.0 Stormwater Pollution Prevention Team

2.1. Stormwater Pollution Prevention Team

The Pollution Prevention Team is responsible for developing, implementing, maintaining, and revising the SWP3 for the facility. Mr. Wes Weatherall, the facility owner/manager, or his designee, coordinates all stages of plan implementation including establishing the monitoring program, maintaining records, and updating the plan as needed and has responsibility over all aspects of the SWP3 and certification authority for the plan.

The Pollution Prevention Team members and responsibilities are summarized in the table

2.2. Team Responsibilities

To ensure comprehensive and effective stormwater management, each member of the team will share in the overall responsibility for implementing and maintaining Best Management Practices (BMPs) across our industrial site. This shared responsibility fosters a proactive and collaborative approach to preventing stormwater pollution.

While overall stormwater management is a collective effort, specific individuals will be assigned responsibility for the diligent management and upkeep of particular BMPs and designated operational areas. This focused approach ensures accountability and allows team members to develop in-depth knowledge of the specific BMPs under their purview.

Clear assignment of these specific responsibilities will be crucial for the successful implementation and long-term effectiveness of our stormwater pollution prevention plan. This structured approach will facilitate regular inspections, timely maintenance, and prompt corrective actions when necessary, ultimately contributing to our compliance with environmental regulations and the protection of our local waterways. Detailed assignments of specific BMP and area responsibilities will be documented separately and communicated to all team members.

All Personnel

The rest of the facilities personnel will participate in the SWP3 training programs. They will have specific SWP3 elements assigned to them to maintain on a regular basis. All remaining facility personnel will be required to actively participate in the comprehensive Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWP3) training programs. Furthermore, these individuals will be assigned specific elements within the SWP3 that they will be responsible for maintaining diligently and on a regular schedule to ensure ongoing compliance and effectiveness of the plan.

3.0 Facility Assessment

3.1 Site Description and Materials

The facility serves as a Auto salvage/Recycling Facility and is situated on approximately Four acres located at 3552 South Highway 19 in Emory, Texas. The facility consists of the following:

- · an office building;
- · parking areas;
- an automobile crusher
- · a scale
- and perimeter fencing

The facility is primarily gravel and unimproved ground cover. The extent of the facility is shown in Figure 1 in Appendix 1.

3.2 Receiving Water Body

Surface flow onsite navigates to the South and Southeast to Outfall 001 utilizing onsite topography. Due to the topography, surface flow is directed towards the following location as shown on Figure 2 (Appendix 1): A facility map, Figure 2 is included in Appendix 1 which indicates surface flow at the facility. Runoff from the Facility ultimately discharges into Muscadine Branch then to Sandy Creek then to The Sabine River segment number 0506. Based on the latest information from the State of Texas 303D list the Sabine River is not impaired.

3.3 Potential Pollutants and Sources-Inventory of Exposed Materials

The potential pollutant sources consist of the following areas that are described in detail below:

- Vehicle and recycling storage area
- · Used fuel/oil storage area; and
- · general yard and vehicle parking areas.

The locations of these areas are detailed on Figure 2 (Appendix 1) and summarized in the Table 3.4 below. The Inventory of Exposed Materials is included in Appendix 2.

3.4.1. Loading/Unloading Area Including vehicle and recycled materials and Truck Loading.

The loading unloading area consists of gravel roads and perimeter fencing. In addition, fluids such as coolant and hydraulic fluid contained within equipment and vehicles during loading and off-loading activities also serve as a potential pollution source. Proper BMPs will be utilized to mitigate potential pollutant runoff.

3.4.2. Used Fuel and Oil Storage Area

The storage area consists of two ASTs containing fuels and Oil within a secondary containment.

3.4.4. General Yard Area

The general yard area contains gravel and unpaved areas, including a parking lot, an office building, and unpaved grassy areas. Surface water from the fuel/oil storage area flows to the south and southeast toward County Road 1280 in the south eastern portion of the facility to Outfall 001.

3.4 Spills and Leaks

Splils and/or leaks must be documented in this SWP3 in Appendix 4. If a spill or leak has occurred it will be documented in the chronological compliance activity log (Appendix 3), and on the spills and/or leaks page (Appendix 4). Spill kits consisting of granular sorbent, containment buckets, absorbent pads and absorbent granules are found within the facility. In the event of a spill, containment is of utmost importance. The goal is to effectively contain a release and prevent material from exiting the respective area of impact. All personal protective equipment (PPE) required to contain and clean spills is located within the facility and consists of gloves, safety glasses, and boots if required. Personnel are trained on spill prevention and response measures and an emergency spill response contractor can be activated in the event of a large release.

Personnel ensure proper labeling of all products and compounds utilized, as specified in the The Junkies LLC plan for easy identification in the event of a spill. In addition, inspection of structural soundness of product drums is tasked to designated personnel within the facility. Safety Data Sheets (SDS) sheets of all compounds and constituents utilized at the facility are made available to all employees and employees are encouraged to familiarize themselves with the appropriate SDS specifications for the particular compounds they work with. In the event of a spill, the Manager is immediately notified, this individual in turn notifies the Environmental Consulting Firm of the incident.

3.5 General Yard Area

The general yard area contains a parking tot, an office building and unpaved grassy areas. The features of the general yard area as they pertain to the SWP3 are discussed in detail below. Grassy areas will be maintained around the perimeter of the facility to maximize sediment and erosion control.

3.5.1 Materials Storage Areas

All material containers will be maintained and properly labeled to prevent contamination of stormwater. SDSs for materials stored and handled at the facility are maintained in the facility office.

3.5.2 Drums

There are no drums stored outside at the facility.

3.5.3 Vehicle Maintenance Shops

Minimal vehicle maintenance is performed at the facility.

3.6 Vehicle and Equipment Cleaning Areas

Minimal equipment or vehicle cleaning is performed at the facility. Occasionally the areas in the loading/unloading area are washed down with water. No detergents are used during this process. Under normal operational conditions, the potential is low for polluted waste streams to escape containment or otherwise be released without treatment. However, the following possible conditions might lead to the release of product:

- · overflow or rupture of tank;
- and malfunction of transfer equipment.

3.7 Vehicle Failure

Any spill or engine leakage due to defective engine seals or other component failure in service units, trucks and trailers will be addressed as quickly as possible when noted. A proactive preventative maintenance program is implemented to mitigate to the greatest extent possible the release of motor fuels and lubricants possibly impacting the ground surface.

3.8 Solid Waste Disposal

A solid waste container is present at the facility for storage of trash and garbage prior to offsite disposal at an appropriately licensed landfill. Wind-blown trash will be picked up regularly around the facility and disposed of in the solid waste container.

3.9 Non-Stormwater Discharges

Non-stormwater discharges can include discharges of process water, air conditioner condensate, non-contact cooling water, vehicle wash water, or sanitary wastes, and are typically the result of unauthorized connections of sanitary or process wastewater drains to storm sewers. The simplest method for detecting non-stormwater connections in the stormwater collection system is to observe all discharge points during periods of dry weather. Key parameters to look for are the presence of stains, smudges, odors, and other abnormal conditions. Non-stormwater discharges are to be eliminated once they are identified either by additional BMPs, redesigning the source/connections, or by source elimination.

Allowable non-stormwater discharges identified in the permit include:

- discharges from fire-fighting activities and fire hydrant flushing;
- potable water including uncontaminated water line flushing;
- landscape irrigation;
- · routine external building wash down that does not use detergents;
- pavement wash waters where spills or leaks of toxic or hazardous materials have not occurred (unless remediated) and where detergents are not used;
- uncontaminated air conditioning or compressor condensate;
- foundation or footing drains where flows are not contaminated with process materials such as solvents;
- · water used to control dust:
- · springs and other uncontaminated groundwater; and
- · incidental wind-blown mist from cooling towers.

Site personnel shall identify and evaluate all non-stormwater discharges within 180 days of filing the NOI. The facility personnel shall conduct a survey of potential non-stormwater sources and will provide certification in **Appendix 5**.

The facility's storm sewer system must be tested or inspected (e.g. screened for dry weather flows) for the presence of no-stormwater flows. Procedures must be evaluated and implemented to eliminate any potential sources that are discovered and not permitted. The SWP3 must be updated based on this evaluation to include the following:

- the date that the evaluation occurred and description criteria used for the evaluation;
- the outfalls or onsite discharge points observed;
- · the different types of identified non-stormwater discharges and their source locations; and
- appropriate BMPs for the non-stormwater discharges, or the actions taken or the control measures used to eliminate them.

3.10 Visual Assessment Monitoring Requirements

Qualified facility personnel must be identified to inspect areas of the facility specified in the SWP3. The inspection frequency must be specified in the SWP3 based upon a consideration of the level of industrial activity at the facility, but must be a minimum of once per month while the facility is in operation. The inspection must take place while the facility is in operation and must, at a minimum, include all areas that are exposed to stormwater at the site. Follow-up procedures must be used to ensure that appropriate actions are taken in response to the inspections. Records of inspections must be maintained (Appendix 6) and be made readily available for inspection upon request.

Accumulated water within the diked areas is first visually inspected for presence of an oily sheen. If no olly sheen is observed, the accumulated water is discharged and the operator will record the discharge event using the discharge log in **Appendix 3**. If present, the oily sheen is removed using absorbent material or pumping any hydrocarbon product to a tank truck and the accumulated water is sampled and analyzed for the required parameters. If found compliant, it is discharged. The cause of the oily sheen is investigated, identified and eliminated.

Stormwater discharges from each outfall authorized by this general permit must be visually examined on a quarterly basis. Monitoring must be conducted during the normal hours of operation for the facility and samples must be collected in a clean, clear, glass or plastic container and examined in a well-lit area. Findings must document observations of the following:

- color:
- · clarity:
- · floating solids;
- · settled solids:
- · suspended solids;
- foam;
- · oil sheen;

- · other obvious indicators of stormwater pollution; and
- noticeable odors.

Some examinations, such as an examination for odor and foam, may necessarily be conducted immediately following collection of the sample. All examinations must be performed in a manner that ensures the sample is representative of the discharge. If this is not possible, then the report must include the reason.

Records of quarterly visual monitoring must include the following information, and the report must be included in the SWP3 in **Appendix 3**:

- (1) sample location(s);
- (2) date and time samples were collected and examined:
- (3) names of personnel who collected and examined the samples;
- (4) nature of the discharge (e.g., runoff, snow melt);
- (5) results of the observations:
- (6) probable sources of any observed contamination;
- (7) visual quality of the stormwater discharge; and
- (8) if necessary, the reason why any samples were not collected within the first 30 minutes of discharge.

Results of the examination must be reviewed by the stormwater pollution prevention team. The team must investigate and identify probable sources of any observed stormwater contamination. The SWP3 must be modified as necessary to address the conclusions of the team.

3.11 Bacteria TMDL Monitoring Requirements

Throughout the United States there are thousands of waters listed for impairments from stormwater sources. The most common pollutants coming from stormwater sources include sediment, pathogens, nutrients, and metals. These impaired waters need a Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL), which identifies the total pollutant loading that a waterbody can receive and still meet water quality standards, and specifies a pollutant allocation to specific point and nonpoint sources. The 0506 segment of the Sabine River is not an impaired waterbody so the TMDL monitoring requirements do not apply.

3.12 Analytical Monitoring Procedures

The other COCs will be analyzed using the following testing methods (or similar):

 Hazardous metals by EPA Methods 6010 B and 7470 A, Total Suspended Solids, Chemical Oxygen Demand. All samples should be representative of the discharge. The grab sample should be collected within the first 30 minutes of discharge. If conditions are such that sampling cannot be completed, or cannot begin in the first 30 minutes, sampling should be completed in the first hour of discharge. In such a situation (where sampling cannot be completed in the first hour of discharge), the timing of collection must be documented and included with all required reports and records of the sampling activity.

3.12.1 Qualifying Storm Events

Monitoring, sampling, examinations, and inspections of stormwater discharges that are required as a provision of this general permit must be conducted on discharges from a measurable storm event that results in an actual discharge from the site, and that follows the preceding measurable storm event by at least 72 hours (3 days). The 72-hour storm interval does not apply if the permittee is able to document that less than a 72-hour (3-day) interval is representative for local qualifying storm events during the sampling period. In the case of snowmelt, the monitoring must be performed at a time when a measurable discharge occurs at the site.

The permittee shall maintain a rain gauge on-site to determine when a qualifying storm event occurs. The rain gauge must be monitored a minimum of once per week, and once per day during storm events. Records of the date and rainfall total must be retained on-site or made readily available for review (**Appendix 3**). Rain gauge monitoring and record-keeping may be temporarily suspended during a given monitoring period if a qualifying storm event has occurred and the required sampling and analyses or visual observations have been performed.

3.12.2 Representative Discharge Samples

All samples must be representative of the discharge.

- (1) Sampling should be conducted within the first 30 minutes of discharge using a grab sample. If it is not practicable to collect the sample or to complete the sampling within the first 30 minutes, then sampling must be completed within the first hour of discharge. If sampling is not completed within the first 30 minutes of discharge, the reason must be documented and attached to all required reports and records of the sampling activity. In the case of snowmelt, samples must be taken during a period with a measurable discharge.
- (2) If alternate sampling requirements are defined in the permit where numeric effluent limitations have been established, the permittee shall comply with the requirements described in the section with the numerical effluent limits; however, other applicable portions of Part III, Section D.2. The General Permit will still apply.
- (3) Authorized Stormwater Discharges that Combine with Other Permitted Flows. If stormwater discharges authorized under this general permit combine with other stormwater or with wastewater authorized under a separate permit, then sampling must be conducted at a point before the waters combine.

(4) Non-Stormwater Discharges. Monitoring of allowable non-stormwater discharges is only required when they are commingled with stormwater discharges associated with industrial activity monitoring period if a qualifying storm event has occurred and the required sampling and analyses or visual observations have been performed.

3.12.3 Monitoring Periods

- (a) Sampling, inspections, and examinations that are required on a quarterly basis must be conducted during the following periods:
 - First (1st) quarter January 1 thru March 31;
 - Second (2nd) quarter April 1 thru June 30;
 - · Third (3rd) quarter July 1 thru September 30; and
 - Fourth (4th) quarter October 1 thru December 31.

Permittees shall begin required sampling, inspections, and examinations on a quarterly basis in the first full quarter following submission of a NOI.

- (b) Sampling, inspections, and examinations that are required on a semiannual basis must be conducted during the following periods:
 - · First (1st) period January 1 thru June 30; and
 - Second (2nd) period July 1 thru December 31.

Permittees shall begin required sampling, inspections, and examinations on a semiannual basis in the first full period following submission of a NOI.

(c) Monitoring, inspections, and examinations that are required on an annual basis must be conducted before December 31st of each calendar year, beginning with the calendar year that includes the first full quarter following submission of an NOI.

If no discharge was made throughout the year, a discharge monitoring report (DMR) stating "no discharge" should be submitted.

3.12.4 Monitoring Data

A summary of existing stormwater discharge sampling results describing pollutants, suspected sources, quality of discharges and problems that have occurred during the previous 3 years is not available as the facility was not in use except for the Explorer Pipeline products area.

3.12.5 Benchmark Monitoring Requirements

Benchmark monitoring of Total Metals, TSS, and COD is required per TPDES TXR050000 Sectors M & N, which specify benchmark concentrations and monitoring details.

3.12.6 Numeric Effluent Limitations Requirements

Typically, all discharges from the facility will only contain stormwater associated with industrial activity. There shall be no discharge of floating solids or visible foam other than trace amounts and no discharge of visible oil.

All eligible discharges of facility wastewater, contact stormwater, and stormwater associated with industrial activities are subject to the following effluent limitations:

3.13 Endangered Species

EPA has determined that issuance of this general permit is unlikely to adversely affect any threatened or endangered species or its critical habitat. EPA sought written concurrence from the United States Fish and Wildlife Service on this determination. In a letter dated September 2, 1998, the United States Fish and Wildlife Service concurred with EPA's finding that issuance of this general permit is not likely to adversely affect any federally listed species, provided that two general concerns were addressed in the permit. The first concern was in regard to the 24-hour acute testing requirement. The Service was concerned that the permit language does not specify as to how test organisms, *daphnia pulex* and the fathead minnow, are used in testing. The Service stated that the permit should state that testing of the effluent requires both species and that failure with either species beyond the 50% survival in 100% effluent would constitute failure.

The second concern was that the permit should include language that permittees located in counties overlying the San Antonio and Barton Springs portion of the Edwards Aquifer (Kinney, Travis, Williamson, Uvalde, Medina, Bexar, Blanco, Hays, and Comal Counties) must consult the Edwards Aquifer Rules (30 TAC Chapter 213) and its amendments. In response to the Service's concerns, a requirement has been added to the Part I.C of the final permit requiring compliance with 30 TAC 213 (Edwards Aquifer Rules). This second concern does not apply to the facility as it is located in McLennan County.

3.14 Historic Places

Facilities which adversely affect properties listed or eligible for listing in the National Register of Historical Places are not authorized to discharge under this permit.

3.15 Permit Requirements

The subsections of this SWP3 address the specific activity categories covered by the General Permit requirements and incorporate, where appropriate, the exposure areas noted above in **Section 3.4**. All activity categories identified by the General Permit are included to allow for addition of such activities to facility operations in the future. As required, it has been noted when a specific activity category does not apply to the facility at this time.

4.0 Best Management Practices (BMPs)

4.1 Non-Structural Controls and BMPs

Nonstructural controls are nonphysical means of reducing the potential for contact between stormwater and significant materials at the source. **Table 4.1** summarizes the nonstructural controls and best management practices implemented at this facility.

Non-Structural Controls and BMPs

Measures and Controls

This section of the plan describes stormwater management controls appropriate for the facility and implementation of such controls. These controls include good housekeeping protocols, preventative maintenance procedures, spill prevention and response procedures, inspections, and employee training and are intended to mitigate the potential risks identified in **Section 3.4**. Measures and controls that fall under multiple categories are repeated as necessary throughout the section. Current measures and controls in place are believed to be sufficient to continue to prevent stormwater pollution at the facility. No new measures or controls are required.

Good Housekeeping

Good housekeeping involves using common sense to identify ways to maintain a clean and orderly facility and keep contaminants out of storm sewers. It includes the establishment of protocols to reduce the possibility of mishandling chemicals or equipment and training employees in good housekeeping techniques. The following subsections identify good housekeeping practices already in place at the facility either through initial equipment design or general daily practices. Each subsection is specific to the activity areas addressed by the General Permit requirements. As appropriate, those areas that do not apply are noted, but included in the event the activity is added to the facility in the future.

Vehicle and Equipment Storage Areas-Not Applicable

Vehicles and equipment requiring maintenance are taken offsite. Minimal vehicle maintenance is currently performed at the facility.

Loading/Unloading Area

This facility conducts commercial Auto Salvage and Recycling Activities. However, the facility also conducts crushing activities described previously under **Section 3.4.1.** All loading/unloading operations meet the minimum requirements of the Texas Department of Transportation regulations governing the transport of recycled products. Best management practices related to good housekeeping for the loading area already implemented include:

 Daily inspection of the loading and unloading area. Inspections ensure loading equipment is not damaged; or otherwise inhibited from operating properly; no foreign debris or equipment might cause an accident; and the uncompromised integrity of curbs in the area. Inspections also identify any standing product or water in the area. It is the responsibility of truck drivers to inspect trucks before loading/unloading and departure. Free fuel product (e.g., from drips or spills) is removed from the loading area with absorbent materials, wash down, squeegees, or other similar materials as needed.

Table 4.1 Non-Structural Controls and BMP

Good Housekeeping

- Thorough daily inspection of tanks and associated piping: Tanks and piping are inspected visually on a daily basis for leakage, malfunctioning of seals, etc. Tanks are checked specifically for drip marks, discoloration, puddles containing spilled or leaked materials, corrosion, cracks, and localized dead vegetation. Piping is specifically checked for droplets of stored material, discoloration, corrosion, bowing of pipe between supports, evidence of stored material seepage, and localized dead vegetation. Foundations of the tanks are checked for cracks, discoloration, puddles containing spilled or leaked materials, settling, gaps between tank and foundations, and damage caused by vegetation roots.
- Limited access to storage areas: Access to the storage tanks is limited to authorized personnel. All exposed piping
 is protected by heavy pipe barriers to prevent damage from vehicles or other equipment. Additionally, the facility
 is adequately illuminated for nighttime operations.
- Spill and leak prevention systems: All bulk storage tanks have high level alarms that notify the pipeline control
 center so the incoming pipeline may be shut down to prevent overfill. In addition, overfill shutdown devices on
 trucks shut off valves.
- Specific protocol for handling and discharging stormwater in the tank areas: Accumulated water within the diked
 areas is first visually inspected for presence of an oily sheen. If no oily sheen is observed, the accumulated water is
 discharged and the operator will record the discharge event using the discharge log in Appendix 3. If present, the
 oily sheen is removed using absorbent material or pumping any hydrocarbon product to a tank truck. The cause of
 the oily sheen is investigated, identified and eliminated.

Vehicle and Equipment Cleaning Areas-Not Applicable

No vehicle or equipment cleaning is currently performed at the facility.

Vehicle and Equipment Maintenance Areas-Not Applicable

No vehicle or equipment maintenance is currently performed at the facility.

Preventative Maintenance

Preventative maintenance is a key to preventing stormwater pollution. The primary management devices related to stormwater pollution prevention include containment structures for both the tank and fuel loading areas. The facility performs routine inspections and maintenance of all stormwater management devices, including but not limited to:

- Inspection and timely repair of primary containment, including original tanks, piping, valves, and other equipment used for storing or transferring fuel product.
- 2. Inspection and timely repair of secondary containment, including curbs, berms, and dikes around storage (e.g. tanks) and loading areas to ensure integrity. This includes inspection of release points (manual outfalls, valves, etc.) and of sealed areas where pipes or other equipment pass through the berm or dike.
- Inspection and timely repair of sumps: Such maintenance includes daily inspection of the concrete covered sump to ensure that it is functioning properly and not obstructed. Cleaning and maintenance of the sump (i.e., removing sludge or other buildup) is conducted as required.
- In addition to preventative inspection and maintenance of stormwater management devices, the facility also regularly inspects and tests facility equipment and systems to uncover conditions that could cause breakdowns or failures resulting in discharges of pollutants to surface waters. This includes, but is not limited to:
- Regular inspection, testing, and timely repair of tanks, piping, pumps, and other product transfer equipment to ensure system integrity. All tanks and piping are inspected visually on a daily basis for leakage, malfunctions of seals, etc. Facility personnel also conduct annual inspections on all storage tanks and report results on the Tank Inspection Report form, copies of which are on file in the facility office.
- Tanks are checked specifically for drip marks, discoloration, puddles containing spilled or leaked materials, corrosion, cracks, and localized dead vegetation.
- 3. Piping and truck coupling equipment is checked for droplets of stored material, discoloration, corrosion, bowing of pipe between supports, evidence of stored material seepage, and localized dead vegetation.
- Foundations of tanks are checked for cracks, discoloration, puddles containing spilled or leaked materials, settling, gaps between tank and foundations, and damage caused by vegetation roots.

Spill Prevention and Response Procedures

Spill prevention and response information is contained in the SWP3 plan by reference and identifies what notification and response measures need to be taken in the event of a large spill or release at the facility and in the event that secondary containment devices fail.

Routine Inspections

The General Permit requires that the facility, specifically all devices related to stormwater control or pollution prevention, be inspected on a quarterly basis. Qualified facility personnel or contractors, as designated by the SWP3 Team, will conduct inspections of the facility. Such personnel will, at a minimum, inspect the following designated areas or activities of the facility on a quarterly basis, and if feasible, conduct one of these inspections during a period when stormwater discharge is occurring:

- Fueling areas, including truck loading areas.
- 2. Fuel loading procedures, including precautions taken for prevention of leaks, spills, etc.
- 3. Material storage areas, including fuel storage tanks, waste tanks, additive tanks, and all associated piping and fuel transfer equipment.
- 4. All devices related to control or management of stormwater runoff and drainage, including but not limited to, curbing, berms, dikes, drains and other water conveyances, valves and pumps.
- General condition of the ground and ground cover at the facility for signs of erosion. Guidelines for facility inspections (Appendix 6) generally encompass many of the routine items that will be inspected during the quarterly inspection, including the condition of piping, tanks, fueling area, etc. Quarterly inspections will also focus on the functionality of equipment specific to stormwater control (see Appendix 3 checklist).

The SWP3 Team will review records of inspections for the purpose of taking action to remedy potential deficiencies (if any). Records of inspections will be maintained on site in Appendix 6 of this plan.

Employee Training

Please refer to Section 5.2

Record Keeping and Internal Reporting Procedures

Record keeping and internal reporting related to this plan is the responsibility of the SWP3 Team presented in Section 2. The following subsections identify record keeping and internal reporting procedures.

Records required to be maintained under the General Permit related to this plan include:

- 1. Ongoing record of changes to this plan (Appendix 10).
- 2. Documentation of historic and current spills and leaks (Appendix 4).
- 3. Summary of sampling results, sampling data and DMRs (Appendix 7).
- 4. Record of employee training (Appendix 8).
- Record of quarterly inspections (Appendix 5).
- 6. Record of annual compliance evaluations (Appendix 6).
- 7. Certification of non-stormwater discharges (Appendix 5).

Records may require certification as outlined by the General Permit. Copies of required records will be maintained at the facility for three years.

Internal Reporting and Communication Procedures

Internal reporting for incidents such as spills, leaks, or other releases, will be conducted in accordance with the SPCC for the facility. These plans detail all required procedures, contacts (both internal and external), and follow up steps required to identify, communicate, and respond to a release. A copy of this plan is maintained at the facility. Facility employees are trained on the plan at least once per year. The Facility Manager is responsible for notifying the Environmental Consultant when changes at the facility are significant enough (e.g., adding tanks, new loading lines, etc.) to potentially require update of one or more plans, including this plan. The Environmental Manager, in turn, is responsible for providing such updated plans to the Facility Manager and ensuring that facility employees are appropriately trained in their contents.

All employees are encouraged to support protection of the environment and provide input on ways to improve pollution prevention. In general, facility employees may communicate observations or issues related to stormwater pollution prevention or environmental issues to the Facility Manager. As appropriate, the Facility Manager will relay information to the Environmental Manager. The Environmental Manager will determine whether the issue has merit, or, in the case of improvement to equipment or procedures, will determine if the recommendation is technically and economically feasible. The Environmental Manager may convene the SWP3 Team or other teams as appropriate to discuss issues.

4.1.1. General Yard Area

Any and all general cleaning and maintenance products utilized in the parking area and shop are kept within the shop and not exposed to storm events. If engine leaks occur due to defective engine seals or other component failure, the unit/truck will be serviced as soon as possible and the spill cleaned up. A proactive approach is implemented and an effective preventative maintenance program is in place to minimize such occurrences.

4.2 Routine Facility Inspections

Qualified personnel, who are familiar with the industrial activities performed at the facility, shall conduct periodic routine facility inspections to determine the effectiveness of the Pollution Prevention Measures and Controls. These inspections must include at least one member of the stormwater pollution prevention team. Inspections must be conducted at least once per quarter unless otherwise specified in Part V of the permit. If feasible, at least one of these routine facility inspections each calendar year must be conducted during a period when a stormwater discharge is occurring.

The facility personnel shall document the findings of each routine facility inspection performed and shall maintain this documentation onsite with the SWP3 (Appendix 6). The inspections must be documented through the use of a checklist that is developed to include each of the controls and measures that are evaluated. At a minimum, the documentation of each routine facility inspection must include:

- (1) the inspection date and time;
- (2) the name(s) of the inspector(s);
- (3) weather information and a description of any discharges occurring at the time of the inspection;
- (4) any previously unidentified discharges of pollutants from the site;
- (5) any control measures needing maintenance or repairs;
- (6) any failed control measures that need replacement;
- (7) any incidents of noncompliance that are observed;
- (8) any additional control measures needed to comply with the permit requirements; and
- (9) identification of any existing BMPs that are not being properly or completely implemented.

This documentation must be signed in accordance with Part III, Section E.6.(c) of the permit. When revisions or additions to the SWP3 are recommended as a result of inspections, a summary description of these proposed changes must be attached to the inspection checklist. The summary must identify any necessary time frames required to implement the proposed changes. The routine facility inspection checklists must be made readily available for inspection and review upon request by authorized TCEQ personnel as well as any local pollution control agency with jurisdiction.

4.3 Structural Controls

Where implementation of the measures required by the TPDES Permit does not control stormwater discharges in accordance with Water Quality Standards, the SWP3 shall provide a description of the location, function, and design criteria of structural controls for prevention and treatment. Structural controls may be necessary to prevent uncontaminated stormwater from contacting or being contacted by significant materials or if preventive measures are not feasible or are inadequate to keep significant materials at the site from contaminating stormwater. Structural controls shall be used to treat, divert, isolate, recycle, reuse or otherwise manage stormwater in a manner that reduces the level of significant materials in the stormwater and provides compliance with Water Quality Standards. The structural controls include physical structures to prevent or minimize the direct contact of stormwater with sources of significant materials. The structural controls and BMPs implemented at this facility are summarized below and basically consist of sediment and erosion control.

 Established grasses across the facility site control sediment loading to downstream water bodies receiving stormwater runoff from the facility.

- Drainage conditions at the facility have not required the use of a retention pond to control
 runoff from the site. Facility runoff management minimizes the introduction of pollutants to
 stormwater runoff as well as reduces the potential impact to off-property facilities and
 downstream water bodies of the runoff itself. The potential of facility activities to contribute to
 pollutants in stormwater discharges is minimal due to the thorough good housekeeping,
 preventative maintenance, emergency response, and sediment control measures previously
 outlined.
 - Current practices for managing runoff are appropriate to minimize leaks and spills. These practices include:
 - 1. Use of containment around a potentially significant source of pollutants (i.e., tanks) to retain runoff falling within the containment area until it can be further inspected for the presence of pollutants as described above. Such containment also allows controlled release of stormwater after significant rainfall events. .

4.4 Spill Prevention and Response

Personnel involved will be thoroughly trained in Spill procedures. In addition, personnel will receive training in inspection of all systems to effectively identify any possible physical or structural compromise to engineering components that might result in an inadvertent release or spill. Personnel will be trained in emergency spill response procedures and adequate personnel protective equipment as well as spill response equipment will be readily accessible during transfer procedures.

Spill kits consisting of granular sorbent, sorbent pads, five gallon buckets, plastic sheeting, and shovels are available and readily accessible in the event of a release. In the event of a spill or inadvertent release of a product, eliminating the source of the release and containment is of utmost importance. The goal is to effectively contain a release and prevent products from migrating and to mitigate any risk to personnel or the environment. All PPE required to contain and clean spills will be made available to on site personnel involved in product transfer and can include half face or full face respirators, safety glasses, tyvek, and rubber wading boots if required. Personnel are trained on appropriate use of PPE and release procedures.

In the event of a fuel spill occurring greater than 25 gallons, the TCEQ Region 5 office is notified and informed that a reportable quantity spill has occurred. The Site Manager and Environmental Consultant are informed immediately of the release and proper source elimination and containment procedures are implemented.

The storage area is provided with secondary containment that can contain the contents of the largest AST with sufficient additional volume for precipitation for a 25-year 24- hour storm event (10.2-inch rainfall event according to the NOAA Rainfall Frequency Atlas of the United States).

Procedures have been implemented for the inspection and/or integrity testing of all containers, piping valves, and ancillary equipment. An agreement with an emergency spill response contractor that identifies and ensures the availability of the necessary personnel and equipment within an appropriate response time is in place.

4.5 Employee Training

The goal of the SWP3 training program is to teach personnel, at all levels of responsibility, the components and objectives of the stormwater pollution prevention plan and to create overall awareness to stormwater pollution prevention concerns. At a minimum, the employee training program must include such topics as spill prevention and response, good housekeeping, and material management practices. The following table, **Table 4.5**, defines the employee training program for this facility.

5.0 Plan Evaluation

5.1 Comprehensive Site Compliance Evaluation

This plan shall be reviewed and evaluated at least once each year, as part of a Comprehensive Site Compliance Evaluation. Based on this review, plan content will be amended as necessary to ensure continued compliance with the TPDES Permit. For each plan review, an entry will be made in the **Appendix 9** and signed after each review. If the plan is determined to be satisfactory through this review, then the entry shall note that no changes were made and will include the signature of the reviewer. If a reportable spill occurs, or if the SWP3 proves to be ineffective in some manner, the plan will be updated, and any spills will be recorded in **Appendix 4**.

The comprehensive site compliance inspection is a required site evaluation and an overall assessment of the effectiveness of the current SWP3. This inspection is in addition to other routine inspections required by the permit; however, it may substitute for a routine facility inspection if it is conducted during the regularly scheduled period of the routine facility inspection and the scope of the inspection is sufficient enough to address both the minimum requirements of the routine inspection and the comprehensive site compliance inspection.

5.1.1. General Requirements

The comprehensive site compliance inspection must be conducted at least once each permit year by one or more qualified employees or designated representatives, including at least one member of the stormwater pollution prevention team. The inspection must include an examination and assessment of:

- (1) all areas identified in the Inventory of Exposed Materials section of the SWP3;
- (2) all structural controls, including the maintenance and effectiveness;
- (3) all non-structural controls (e.g., good housekeeping measures, scheduling, etc.);
- (4) all areas where spills and leaks have occurred in the past three (3) years; (5) all reasonably accessible areas immediately downstream of each outfall that is authorized under this general permit:
- (6) industrial materials, residue, or trash that may have or could come into contact with storm water;
- (7) leaks or spills from industrial equipment, drums, tanks, and other containers;
- (8) offsite tracking of industrial or waste materials, or sediment where vehicles enter or exit the
- (9) tracking or blowing of raw, final, or waste materials from areas of no exposure to exposed areas:
- (10) a review of the results of the past year's visual and analytical monitoring when planning and conducting inspections that are required by this general permit; and
- (11) any control measures needing replacement, maintenance, or repair.

5.1.2. Annual Comprehensive Site Compliance Inspection Report

Within 30 days of performing the annual site compliance inspection, the permittee shall prepare a report that includes a narrative discussion of compliance with the current SWP3. The report must be signed and certified in accordance with Part III, Section E.6.(c) of the permit, and must either be included as a part of the SWP3 or referenced in the SWP3 and be made readily available for inspection and review upon request by authorized TCEQ personnel as well as any local pollution control agency with jurisdiction. The report must document all of the following information:

- (1) name(s) and title(s) of the personnel conducting the inspection;
- (2) the date(s) of the inspection;
- (3) findings from the inspection of areas of the facility;
- (4) observations relating to the implementation of control measures:
 - a. previously unidentified discharges from the site;
 - b. previously unidentified pollutants in existing discharges;
 - c. evidence of, or the potential for, pollutants entering the drainage system; d. evidence of pollutants discharging to receiving waters, and the condition of and around each outfall; and
 - e. additional control measures needed to address any conditions requiring corrective action identified during the inspection.
- (5) revisions to the SWP3 made as a result of the inspection; and
- (6) any incidents of non-compliance:
 - a. For purposes of this inspection, an incident of non-compliance is any instance where an element of the SWP3 is either not implemented, or where specific conditions of the permit are not met.
 - b. If no incidents of non-compliance are discovered, the report must contain a certification by the permittee that the facility is in compliance with the SWP3. If an incident or incidents of non-compliance is identified, then the report must include all necessary actions to remedy the non-compliance. The identified actions must be completed as soon as practicable, but no later than 12 weeks following the completion of the report.

5.1.3. Revision of the SWP3

Within 12 weeks following the completion of the Annual Site Compliance Inspection Report, the permittee shall revise and implement the SWP3 to include and address the findings of the report. Revisions must include all changes

resulting from the report and all applicable updates to the following:

- (1) elements of the SWP3 requiring modification;
- (2) controls (e.g. structural controls or BMPs) that should be added or modified; (3) site map;
- (4) inventory of exposed materials;
- (5) description of the good housekeeping measures;
- (6) description of structural and non-structural controls; and
- (7) any other element of the plan that was either found to be inaccurate or will be modified.



Automotive Wrecking and Salvage Yard Regulation

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE TEXAS TRANSPORTATION CODE 396; PROVIDING FOR SCREENING OF COVERED BUSINESS; PROVIDING FOR LICENSING; PROVIDING FOR REQUIREMENT FOR LICENSING; PROVIDING FOR SECURITY OF AUTOMOTIVE LIQUIDS AND TIRES; PROVIDING FOR NOTICES AND HEARINGS; POVIDING FOR REVOCATION AND RENEWAL OF LICENSING; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNTY OF RAINS, TEXAS.

SECTION 1. ADOPTED:

There is hereby adopted the Texas Transportation Codes 396, as amended.

SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS:

- (A) "Automotive wrecking and salvage yard" means any person or business that stores three or more vehicles for the purpose of dismantling or wrecking the vehicles to remove parts for sale or for use in automotive repair or rebuilding.
- (B) "Junk" means copper, brass, Iron, steel, rope, rags, batteries, tires or other material that has been discarded or sold at a nominal price by a previous owner of the material. (The term does not include wrecked vehicles.)
- (C) "Junkyard" means an enterprise that owns and is operated to store, buy or sell junk, all or part of which is kept outdoors until disposal.
- (D) "Recycling business" means a business enterprise that is primarily engaged in the business of:
 - (1) Converting metal or any other materials into raw material products, having prepared grades and having an existing or potential economic value;
 - (2) Using raw material products of that kind in the production of new products; or
 - (3) Obtaining or storing metal or other materials for a purpose described by Paragraph (A) or (B) of this subdivision.
- (E) 'Wrecked vehicle" means a discarded, abandoned, junked, wrecked or worn-out automotive vehicle, that is not licensed or in a condition to be lawfully operated on a public road.
- (F) "Road", refers to any public roadways, to include all county roads.
- (G) "Covered Business" means automobile wrecking and salvage yard or junkyard.
- (H) "To begin operation," means the date a tax number is obtained by the covered business; for storage yards that do not use a tax number, the date the property is rendered to the proper Rains County taxing authority; or, the use of the property becomes evident to the Commissioners Court.

SECTION 3: EXEMPTIONS

- (A) The screening requirement established by Section 4 of this Act does not apply to:
 - (1) a recycling business;
 - (2) a junkyard or an automotive wrecking and salvage yard that is located entirely within a municipality and that is subject to regulation in any manner by the municipality.
- (B) The county Licensing provisions of Section 5 of this Act do not apply to:
 - (1) a recycling business;
 - (2) a junkyard or an automotive wrecking and salvage yard that is located entirely within a municipality and that is subject to regulation in any manner by the municipality.

SECTION 4: SCREENING REQUIREMENT

A person who operates a junkyard or an automotive wrecking and salvage yard in this state shall screen it by natural objects, plantings, fences or other appropriate means so that the screen is at least eight (8) feet in height, alongside that portion of the junkyard or automotive wrecking and salvage yard that faces a road or a family residence. Additionally, the screening must be such that no part of the junkyard or automobile wrecking and salvage yard may be visible from any public road, business, or residence. The structure must be erect and plumb.

SECTION 5: COUNTY LICENSURE

- (A) To protect the public health, safety, or welfare, the Commissioners' Court of Rains County is adopting this ordinance and requiring that a junkyard or automobile wrecking and salvage yard be licensed by the County. The following conditions must be met in order to obtain a license:
 - (1) Any person desiring a license shall make a written application, which shall be sworn to, on forms provided by the County. Four (4), 8 X 10 color photographs, showing the entire property, covered by the business, from a Northern, Southern, Eastern and Western view. Fee and application is to be filed with the County Clerk's Office.
 - (2) Submit a plat showing compliance with the location requirements from a registered surveyor.
 - (3) Pay a fee of \$25.00 for the issuance or renewal of the license
 - (4) Be no closer than 50 feet to any road, subdivision, residence, business, or waterway under the authority of the Texas Natural Resource Commission.
 - (5) Agree to allow the Health Department and Environmental Enforcement Department to enter said premises for on site inspections at any reasonable time. Said inspections will be unannounced.
 - (6) Upon receipt of said application, the County Clerk shall post the application in the county courthouse. It must be posted for a period of fourteen (14) days prior to any approval action by Commissioners' Court.
 - (7) An operator may not discharge automotive fluids onto the ground. Automotive fluids include, but are not restricted to: fuel, lubricating oils and greases, hydraulic fluids, antifreeze/coolant compounds, brake fluids, liquid tire leakage repair compounds or storage battery acids.

- (8) Fluids generated by the application of any cleaning solution or water used for cleaning automotive parts or assemblies, may not be discharged onto the ground. This includes, but is not restricted to; hosing, washing, pressure washing, steam cleaning or solvent cleaning.
- (9) Storage batteries may not be stored on the ground, but must be elevated off the ground and sheltered from precipitation to prevent ground and/or water pollution through run-off. Storage batteries with broken or leaking cases must be stored in a containment vessel capable of retaining all the fluid in the battery. This containment vessel must be constructed of a material capable of containing the battery fluid without corroding or decomposing.
- (10) Un-mounted tires must be sheltered from precipitation to prevent water retention, creating a mosquito-breeding environment.

SECTION 6. REVOCATION AND RENEWAL

: .

- (A) Commissioners Court may revoke or suspend any license if:
 - (1) Any provisions for screening are violated;
 - (2) The said junkyard or automotive wrecking and salvage yard fails to permit inspections by the Health Department or the Environmental Enforcement Officer;
 - (3) The operator fails to remedy any violation of the Health Department or Environmental Enforcement Department rules and regulations.
 - (4) Any requirements have not been met or the contents of the application have been falsified.
- (B) Renewal of said license may be denied if:
 - Any provisions for screening are violated;
 - (2) The said junkyard or automotive wrecking and salvage yard fails to permit inspections by the Health Department and Environmental Enforcement Officer.
 - (3) The owner fails to remedy any violations of the Health Department or Environmental Enforcement Department rules and regulations
 - (4) it is determined that any requirements have not been met or the contents of the application have been falsified
- (C) Whenever a license is suspended or revoked, written notice shall be given to the permit holder, the person in charge or any employee or agent of the covered business and such notice shall state:
 - (1) Specific conditions of the alleged violation ~
- (2) The date and time of the hearing to be held concerning the suspension and revocation.
 - (3) That the licensee may appear in person, be represented by counsel, present testimony and cross-examine all witnesses; such hearing shall be held no later than 30 days after the date of the revocation or suspension.
 - (E) Said license may be renewed annually if the conditions for the initial licensing are met. As to Section (3), if an affidavit is submitted testifying to the fact that the covered business has not expanded its location and was in compliance with Section 5 (A), when the original license was obtained, no new plat will be required.

SECTION 7. INJUNCTION

Any person is entitled to injunctive relief to prevent a violation or threatened violation of this ordinance as provided for in Texas Transportation Code 396.002

SECTION 8. CRIMINAL PENALTY

A person, who knowingly violates this ordinance, commits an offense. An offense under this subsection is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not less than \$100 or more than \$500. Each day a violation continues is a separate offense. After 90 days, a notice of attachment may be sent and the property seized. Said property will be sold and revenue from the sale will be used for site clean up.

SECTION 9. EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance takes effect immediately upon passage by the Rains County Commissioners Court. All covered businesses shall make application within 30 days of the passage of the Ordinance. Thereafter, all new, covered operations shall make application within thirty (30) days of their existence in the County.

SECTION 10. PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE

If any section, subsection, word, sentence or phrase of this ordinance is declared to be invalid, it shall not affect the validity nor intent of this ordinance.

SECTION 11. PUBLIC HEARING

Before adopting this ordinance the provisions for public notice and a public hearing as outlined in the Transportation Code 396.042 and 396.043 will be strictly adhered to by the Commissioners' Court.

The application must be completed and signed by the applicant. An application is not considered complete and will not be processed until all required items have been submitted. All information provided must be typed or printed in <u>black ink</u>. Attachments must be submitted on separate pieces of single-sided, 8½" x 11" paper. Use a paperclip to fasten all pages together, with the check or money order on top. **Do not use staples**.

DOCUMENTS SUBMITTED WITH YOUR APPLICATION WILL NOT BE RETURNED. KEEP A COPY OF YOUR COMPLETED APPLICATION, ALL ATTACHMENTS, AND YOUR CHECK OR MONEY ORDER.

- 1. BUSINESS NAME Write the full name of your business to be registered (40 character maximum).
- DOING BUSINESS AS (DBA) NAME Write the full DBA name for your business.

What is a "Doing Business As" Name? A fictitious name (or assumed name, trade name or DBA name) is a business name that is different from your personal name, the names of your partners or the officially registered name of your LLC or corporation.

SUBTITLE H. HIGHWAY BEAUTIFICATION

CHAPTER 396. AUTOMOBILE WRECKING AND SALVAGE YARDS

SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS

Sec. 396.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:

- "Automotive wrecking and salvage yard" means an outdoor place where a person stores three or more vehicles for the purpose of dismantling or wrecking the vehicles to remove parts for sale or for use in automotive repair or rebuilding.
- "Junk" means copper, brass, iron, steel, rope, rags, batteries, tires, or other material that has been discarded or sold at a nominal price by a previous owner of the material. The term does not include a wrecked vehicle.
- "Junkyard" means a place where a business that owns junk, and is operated to store, buy, or sell junk, keeps all or part of the junk outdoors until the business disposes of the junk.
- "Recycling business" means a business primarily engaged in (4)the business of:
- (A) converting metal or other material into raw material products that have:
 - (i)prepared grades; and
 - (ii) an existing or potential economic value;
- using raw material products described by Paragraph (A) in the production of new products;
- obtaining or storing metal or other material for a purpose described by Paragraph (A) or (B).
- "Wrecked vehicle" means a discarded, junked, damaged, or worn-out automotive vehicle that is not in a condition to be lawfully operated on a public road.

- Sec. 396.002. INJUNCTION. (a) A person is entitled to an injunction to prohibit a violation or threatened violation of this chapter or of a county ordinance adopted under this chapter.
- (b) The venue for the injunction proceeding is in the county in which any part of the junkyard or automotive wrecking and salvage yard is located.

SUBCHAPTER B. SCREENING REQUIREMENTS AND LOCATION

Sec. 396.021. SCREENING REQUIREMENTS. (a) This section does not apply to:

- an automotive wrecking and salvage yard as defined by and subject to Chapter 397;
- (2) a junkyard as defined by Section 391.001 and subject to Subchapter E, Chapter 391;
 - (3) a recycling business; or
- (4) a junkyard or an automotive wrecking and salvage yard entirely in a municipality and regulated by the municipality.
- (b) A person who operates a junkyard or an automotive wrecking and salvage yard shall screen the junkyard or automotive wrecking and salvage yard with a solid barrier fence at least eight feet high. The fence must be painted a natural earth tone color and may not have any sign appear on its surface other than a sign indicating the business name.
- (c) A person who operates a junkyard or an automotive wrecking and salvage yard in a county with a population of 200,000 or less shall screen the junkyard or automotive wrecking and salvage yard to at least six feet in height along the portion of the junkyard or automotive wrecking and salvage yard that faces a public road or residence. The person may screen the yard by any appropriate means, including:
 - (1) a fence;
 - (2) natural objects; or
 - (3) plants.

- (1) within 50 feet of the right-of-way of a public street or state highway; or

- (b) A person may not accumulate or stack materials associated with a junkyard or an automotive wrecking and salvage yard higher than eight feet above ground level.
- (c) This section does not apply to a junkyard or an automotive wrecking and salvage yard used only for farm equipment.

SUBCHAPTER C. COUNTY REGULATION OF JUNKYARDS OR AUTOMOTIVE WRECKING AND SALVAGE YARDS

Sec. 396.041. COUNTY LICENSE. (a) This section does not apply to:

- (1) a recycling business;
- (2) a junkyard or automotive wrecking and salvage yard located entirely in a municipality and subject to regulation by the municipality; or
- (3) a junkyard or automotive wrecking and salvage yard in operation before June 1, 1987.

- (b) To protect the public health, safety, or welfare, the commissioners court of a county may by ordinance require a junkyard or automotive wrecking and salvage yard to be licensed by the county.
 - (c) An ordinance may:
 - (1) impose a fee of \$25 for the issuance or renewal of a license;
 - (2) impose a fee of not more than:
- (A) \$150 for the issuance or renewal of a license, if the ordinance is adopted by the commissioners court of a county with a population of one million or more that contains two or more municipalities, each of which has a population of 250,000 or more; or
- (B) \$500 for the issuance or renewal of a license, if the ordinance is adopted by the commissioners court of a county with a population of 3.3 million or more;
- (3) condition the license on the operation of the junkyard or automotive wrecking and salvage yard only at a location approved by the commissioners court or a county employee designated by the commissioners court; or
- (4) establish grounds for suspending or revoking a license if the junkyard or automotive wrecking and salvage yard is not screened.
- (d) The county shall deposit each license fee received to the credit of the county general fund.

- (2) published at least once a week for the three weeks preceding the week the public hearing is held.

In reference to your questions below:

If you have a towing license from TDLR, it would depend on the type of restrictions you have on that license (regular towing, private property towing, scene management). You would have to have Scene Management license in order to tow wrecks etc for the County or State. However, the County does such a small amount of towing, it would not be worth your time to base your growth potential on the County towing business.

Dumpster rentals: The county does not require a license for you to operate this type of business, such as Gaston, where you take a container to customer, they fill it up and you come get it and dispose of it at a landfill. If you plan to have a Drop Off trash location, then you will have to follow more strict procedures from TCEQ.

The same goes for recyclables drop of location. I recommend you refer to: Texas Health and Safety Code 361.425-361.426 and TCEQ ruler 328.200-204. All non-exempt governmental bodies (cities, counties, school districts, etc.) must: 1. Establish programs for Separation and Collection of recyclables, 2. Provide storage containers and procedures for cells and contracting with buyers, 3. Monitor and adjust the program as needed, 4. Offer education or incentives to boost participation.
